Print this room analysis worksheet. Place it on a clipboard and walk around the room. Take your time and look critically at every aspect. Pretend you are a stranger and seeing the room for the first time. Answer the questions below to get a new view of the room and space available to you.

<p>What is the shape of the room? (long and rectangular, square, odd dimensions with nooks and crannies)</p>	
<p>What is it's size? (large and spacious, small and cramped, cozy, intimidating)</p>	
<p>What are the architectural details?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are there too many or too few doors and windows?</li> <li>• Are the ceilings high or low?</li> <li>• Are there special types of windows?</li> <li>• Sliding glass doors?</li> <li>• Fireplaces?</li> <li>• Closets?</li> <li>• Special woodwork?</li> </ul>

<p>Position of Utilities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are there enough electrical outlets?</li> <li>• Are the conveniently located?</li> <li>• Are the phone lines adequate?</li> <li>• Do you have hot air ducts? Baseboard heat? Radiators?</li> </ul>	
<p>Traffic Patterns</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Is the traffic pattern easy to navigate or is it cluttered?</li> <li>• Can you see into an adjoining room?</li> <li>• Do you have to walk through one activity area (such as conversation area) to get to another activity area (TV watching)?</li> </ul>
